- Shall I keep this for me and share it only 3 years later?


User-engaged research (Rickinson et al, 2011)

• The results of research are more likely to be considered by policy makers if they have some involvement in the research process.

INTERRUPTIONS

- **Research process**: Suggesting options, challenging assumptions, suggesting alternative interpretations.
- **Policy-making process**: Challenging the research questions, suggesting interpretations or ways to access to data.
